

Our Classroom:

Breakfast, Snack and Lunch

- All students receive a free breakfast in the classroom each morning when they arrive.
- Each day we provide a snack for students.
- Students can either bring a lunch or buy a lunch at school.
- When students buy a lunch, they will choose fresh fruits and vegetables and a hot entree.
- Please send your child to school with only healthy food items. We discourage students from bringing in soda and candy.
- We only have 25 minutes to each lunch!

Recess and Spare Clothes

- Make sure to check the weather each morning.
- We go outside for 30 minutes each day, even in the winter!
- Please send in your child with the appropriate clothes for the season, including hats, gloves and boots.
- Each child needs a spare change of clothes.
 We will send these home to be changed seasonally. There are not extra clothes at school.
- All clothes worn at school will be played in.
 Please do not send your child to school in clothes you do not want to get dirty.

- Home-School Relationship







 - Follow I and 2 step directions




Getting Ready for Kindergarten!


Prepare your child for Kindergarten!


